

~ Please read this before your child's vaccinations~

* If you move out of the city, you will not be able to use this vaccination notebook. Please check with the local government where you are moving out for vaccination (vaccination cannot be done on the day of moving out).

2. Before having your child vaccinated

- (1) Please read this immunization notebook and "Immunization and Child Health (Booklet)" carefully in advance to understand the need for vaccination and its side effects.
- (2) Depending on the medical facility, the dates and times for vaccinations may be set in advance. Please contact your vaccination facility in advance.
- (3) Observe your child carefully from the morning on the day of vaccination, and confirm that nothing is out of the ordinary. As a rule, children should only get vaccinated if they are well. Even if a vaccination is scheduled, do not have the vaccination done if your child appears sick.
- (4) A parent or guardian who is familiar with the child's usual condition should accompany them to the vaccination. If the child must be accompanied by someone other than their parent or guardian, a letter of authorization will be required from the parent or guardian. Please prepare the letter of authorization in advance and submit it to the medical facility.
- (5) The vaccination screening questionnaire is a vital source of information for the physician who provides the vaccination. Please fill it out completely and accurately. Omissions or errors in the vaccination screening questionnaire may cause vaccination errors, and a cost will be incurred for vaccinations outside of regular vaccinations (optional vaccinations). Please read the notes carefully before filling out the form.
- (6) The child's temperature will also be taken at the medical facility.
- (7) If you do not have your Maternal and Child Health Handbook with you, your child will not be able to get the vaccination. Make sure to bring it with you.

< Items to Bring>

- 1. Maternal and Child Health Handbook
- 2. Health insurance card and other documents to confirm your address in Kashiwa City
- 3. Vaccination screening questionnaire (The preliminary examination slip attached to this vaccination notebook with the vaccination number sticker or the vaccination number)
- ★ Kashiwa City issues vaccination numbers to children in order to accurately manage vaccination history information based on the Immunization Law. The vaccination number sticker is sent with this vaccination notebook. Put it on the cover of your vaccination notebook and on the vaccination record page of your Maternal and Child Health Handbook, and don't forget your vaccination number.

Vaccination records

- The medical facility that provided the vaccination will make a record of the vaccination in the
 Maternal and Child Health Handbook.
- Vaccination records will be required in the future for pursuing education and employment,
 and overseas travel. These are important records. Please keep them in a safe place.
- If you do not know your vaccination history because your Maternal and Child Health Handbook
 has been lost or damaged, please check your vaccination history at the medical facility or
 municipality where the vaccinations were provided.
